Philadelphia Markets. MONDAY, May 30, P. M. - The foreign advices, although decidedly favorable for bread stuffs, have no perceptible effect upon our prices. The market for flour is exceedingly dull, there being a total absence of any speculative or shipping demand, and the only sales are in a small way for home consumption at \$7 a 50 per barrel for common, superfine and good extra at \$7 25 a \$8 50 for extra family and fancy lots, in bulk. The Flour is steady at \$1 75 and Corn Meal at \$1 per barrel, but there is nothing doing in either.

GRAIN - The demand for Wheat continues limited at a further decline and there is no offer. Sales of 3000 bushels good Red at \$1 60 per bushel, and White at \$1 70 a 1 80. Rye is steady, with small sales. Corn Family and dull. Sales of 4000 bushels, yellow, at 50 cents a bushel. In Oats the only sales are 1500 a 2000 bushels Penn. at 40 cents per bushel. No change in Bulw of Barley Malt.
