this tax there should be such revision of the ax haws as will hereafter equitably apportant the burden among the various interests now subject or that properly can be made subject to taxation. The saving of fifteen for cent, to the people of the State by the gestumption is a matter worthy of thought, but a more importan consideration is that it will enable you who represent all the varied interests of the Commonwealth to appose to the tax in such manner as to bear equally upon all. Our revenue laws had imposed on real and personnal property as is full proportion but little more than one third of the taxes needed for the ordinary expenditures of the Government. By the need to fit the cent of 15th May last, the tax on this species of property has already been increased one sixth. Should the State refuse to assume the United States tax the whole burden of it will fall upon these interests interests to most unfavorably affected by the war, whilst ether kinds of property and other sources of revenue, judged by our laws able to pay mearly two thirds of the present revenues of the State would not be called on to contribute one dollar of additional tax.

The militia system of the Commonwealth is very imperfect. I recommend the establishment of a commission to frame and report a system more addiquate to the exigen.
