WASHINGTON March 12. The following orders by the President were published by authority in the Intelligence of this morning...

EXECUTIVE MANSION, Washington, Jan. 27 1862. PRESIDENT'S GENERAL WAR ORDER NO. 1.

Ordered, That the 22d day of February, 1862, be the day for a general movement of the land and naval forces of the United States against the insurgent forces...

EXECUTIVE MANSION, Washington, March 8, 1862. PRESIDENT'S GENERAL WAR ORDER NO. 2.

Ordered, First—That the Major General Commanding the army of the Potomac proceed forthwith to organize that part of said army to enter upon active operations...
