who fell while bravely fighting the battles  
of his country; and as honorable tributes  
of respect to the dead are due, and such evidence  
as the regulations of which show, we  
desire to place on record a faithful expres-  
sion of our sense of the loss sustained by  
our Order in our brother's untimely demise,  
and also to express our sympathy with the  
feelings of his bereaved relatives and friends. Therefore,

Resolved, That this Lodge has lost a worthy and  
devoted member; the community, a citizen  
whose integrity won for him the respect and  
esteem of all who knew him, and the  
country, an efficient soldier.

Resolved, That in view of the relatives  
of our lamented brother, assurance of our  
strong and earnest sympathy with them in  
this their hour of mourning, knowing that  
the strength to bear their affliction must  
come from Him who sent it, and though  
they drink deeply of sorrow, we ex-  
pressing comfort and consolation from  
the mouth of that merciful Father

DEATH OF BOB VALENTINE, ESQ.—This  
community was much startled on Wednesday  
morning, to learn of the death of Bob  
Valentine, Esq., one of the old and most  
respected citizens of our town. Mr. Valentine  
had long and suddenly, having up till  
ten o'clock on Tuesday evening, enjoyed his  
usual good health. We learn he was at the  
Telegraph Office at that hour, but soon after  
his return home, was seized with a mortal  
illness which terminated his long and useful  
life in a few hours. He died about 2 o'clock  
on Wednesday morning. We understand it  
was Mr. Valentine's intention to have gone  
to Baltimore on Wednesday morning, and  
that he had made arrangements to that effect.  
His pleasant anticipations were sud-  
denly overthrown by the cold hand of  
death.

The funeral took place on Thursday af-  
ternoon in the midst of a pouring rain, and,  
considering the state of the weather, was  
largely attended, thus giving evidence of the  
respect in which Mr. Valentine was held by  
this community. In his death, the society  
of Friends, to whom he belonged, loses one  
of its most consistent and upright members,  
and the community a most estimable man  
and a good citizen.
