## WHAT THE ALABAMA CONVEN-TION PROPOSES TO DO.

The constitution submitted to the people of Alabama by the Military Reconstruction Convention contains provisions which, if ratified, will accomplish the following results;

1. To premit every negro to vote, whatever his competency or incompetency, who has been in the State six months and county three months

2. To permit to vote only such white men as may have been in the State six months and in the county three months, who will swear never to change the proposed constitution, so far as it affects the question of suffrage.

8. To deprive of the privilege of voting and holding office-Eirst-All whites this for all common sore throats. who may be disfranchised by the proposed constitutional amendment (14 article) and by the reconstruction acts. that is to say, all who held any office federal or State, of the lowest grade before the war and afterwards gave aid or sympathy to the Confederate cause This provision, according to the registration returns, will disfranchise 37,000 white men of the State.
