It employs some seven hundred and odd officials whose salaries amount yearly to a million of dollars. Then there are the annual expenditures for clothing. subsistence, schooling and transports tion, amounting to millions. And all is justified on the idea that the negroes are the "wards of the Nation" - that is persone who in contemplation of law and in fact, are unable to take care of them-Belves-a phrase invented by that hum. bug philanthropist, Sumner, to cover over the partisan object of the Buresu
