GEARY—I have this day transmitted to the Senate for the consideration of the General Assembly, a duly attested copy of a concurrent resolution of the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America entitled "A resolution proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States," received from the Department of State, Washington, D. C., a copy of which is herewith enclosed. I cordially approve this action of the National Congress and unhesitatingly recommend the prompt ratification of the same by the Legislature. John W. Geary. White men of Pennsylvania, we appeal to you! Can you, will you endorse this infamous action by voting for a man who urged your servants to heed not your wishes, but to make negro voters despite your remonstrances. Have you respect for yourself, your wives, your children, your race, your blood. SCOUR THE WHITE NIGGER—who would force you into the filthy pool of mongrelism; who says by his actions that you are not capable of governing yourselves but that NEGROES SHALL CHOOSE AND MAKE SLAVES OF YOU? THE REGISTRY LAW.

How to Vote if not Registered! A Word to the Naturalized, the Laboring Men and others. To the Democratic Voters of Pennsylvania.—We are indebted to James H. Hopkins, Esq., of Pittsburg, Deputy Chairman of the Democratic State Committee for Western Pennsylvania for the following. It may appear that by some fraud or criminal neglect your name is omitted from the registry list. Understand that this will not deprive you of your vote. YOU CAN VOTE, ALTHOUGH NOT REGISTERED. But it is required, if not registered, to make an affidavit, stating to the best of his knowledge and belief, where and when he was born, and that he is a citizen of Pennsylvania and the United States, that he has resided in the State one year, or if formerly a citizen therein and removed therefrom, that he has resided therein six months next preceding said election; that he had not moved in the district for the purpose of voting therein; that he has paid a State and county tax within two years, which was assessed at least ten days before the election, and the affidavit shall state when and where the tax was assessed and paid, and the tax receipt must be produced, unless the affiant shall state that it has been lost or destroyed, or that he received none. In addition to this, you must prove by the printed or written name of some qualified voter in your district, your precise residence in that district for at least ten days next preceding the election. NATURALIZED CITIZENS in addition to all this must state in their affidavit when, where and by what court they were naturalized and what produce their "papers." The necessary blanks for making these affidavits should be furnished to you by the election officers, upon your request; should they refuse, prepare them yourselves, embodying all the essential facts; and the election officers are bound to receive your vote, or be subject to severe penalties. Persons between twenty-one and twenty-two years old may vote on age, as heretofore, without payment of tax, whether registered or not. Let no demerit or conservative be deterred from voting by the provisions of this law. EVERY MAN WHO COULD VOTE PRIOR TO THE PASSAGE OF THE REGISTRY LAW, MAY STILL VOTE. The law was intended to place so many obstacles in the way of the naturalized citizens, as to disgust them, and keep them from the polls. The Radical party, which passed this law, looks upon this class of our citizens with contempt, and hedges them about with requirements bristling with suspicion. So, too, this Radical party would degrade and humiliate the laboring men, whether native born or naturalized, by requiring them to mark the name of their employer opposite their own on the Registry. This attempt to create an appearance of unsalvage, or to indicate that laboring men have masters or owners on election day, is one of the most infamous features of this disgraceful law. Naturalized citizens and all laboring men, assert your manhood! Resist this insult! Comply with the law this once in order to secure its repeal by voting the Democratic ticket. You may be challenged, although regularly registered. In that case the same proof must be made as was required under the old election laws. Be prepared! Take with you to the polls your tax receipts, your naturalization papers, and a friend who knows your residence. You have the right to challenge, see that you use it! Mark every name on the list that you do not know, and challenge every unknown person whether registered or not, who presents himself to vote. Do not be intimidated! This is your right and duty. Stand firmly and boldly all day at the polls, let no illegal or doubtful votes be cast; see that every democrat votes; and a decisive and glorious victory will reward your labors. Democrats! Examine your tickets carefully before voting—see that you vote the whole Democratic ticket.

Stubborn Facts.

After all that has been said by our Radical opponents in defence of their peculiar system of administering the government, the following facts, according to the Cincinnati Enquirer, remain proved: 1. That the Government is paying \$30,000,000 per year for the National Bank currency, when it could issue greenbacks for nothing. 2. The Federal Government has power to tax the bonds the same as other property is taxed. This would yield a revenue of \$50,000,000 per year, and save the people the tax on coffee, sugar, tea and salt, but a Republican Congress has refused to do it. 3. Under the law, as it stands, the ten forty bonds are payable in gold and five twenties in greenbacks, but the Republicans have agreed to pay them both in gold, thus adding \$600,000,000 to \$8,000,000,000 to the National Debt! besides violating pledged faith to the people. 4. The Government is now paying \$1.25 on the dollar for over due bonds that are redeemable at par, which is simply stealing—no more nor less. 5. The result of the election this fall may determine the fate of the Fifteenth Amendment, and decide whether Negro Suffrage shall be forced upon us by the action of the Federal Government. 6. The present high protective tariff taxes goods not upon their value, which is the only fair rule, but upon their measurement and weight. Thus the great burdens of Government are laid upon the poor, who consume the cheaper articles. The Democratic tariff was ad valorem, and not specific. 7. Upon every article which comes in from abroad—tea, coffee, sugar, salt, clothing, of all sorts (for men and women's wear), lumber, spices, jewelry, articles of necessity and luxury—there is now levied, on the average, the monstrous duty of forty four per cent in gold. Under an economical Democratic Administration ten to fifteen per cent would be sufficient. 8. The war closed in April, 1865, more than four years ago. In that time the taxes collected from the people amount to nearly \$2,000,000,000. This, if all applied on the National debt would nearly have extinguished it; and yet, as it appears from the official reports, the debt was larger on September 1, 1869, than it was on September 1, 1865! What has the Republican party done with the \$2,000,000,000 since the war? 9. So entirely is the Republican party under the domination of New England, that it allows the Yankee fisherman to have his salt free of duty for packing codfish and mackerel while the Western farmer, and dealer, who pack beef and pork, have to pay a duty of 110 per cent. on that article. 10. The expenses of the army are estimated, for this year, in time of profound peace, to be \$91,000,000. During the last Democratic Administration the whole expenses of the Government were only \$70,000,000. These facts and figures would seem to indicate the necessity of an early change in the Administration of the Government. Gov. Geary and his ticket are committed to these abuses; Mr. Packard and the Democracy are against them. From the report of the Radical meeting at New Holland, recently, in the Lancaster Intelligencer, which was addressed by Governor Geary, we extract the following in reference to the Governor's speech: He took no notice of the repeated charges brought against him by the Pittsburg Dispatch, the Philadelphia Evening Telegraph, and other leading Radical papers, but he did pitch in heavy against our friend P. Gray Meer, of the Bellefonte Watchman, for having charged him with pilfering Twitchell, and intimating that he was now somewhere among the Rocky Mountains. "That man Meer" said the Governor, "is a dirty, stinking skunk, and started the vile slanders, for the purpose of inveigling me into a libel suit; but I learned too many tricks while I was in the army to be caught in such a trap as a libel suit with an editor, and particularly such a one as that unholy, lying scoundrel, Meer. We have only to say, in regard to the above, that if we are a worse 'skunk' than the Governor, unlike him, the fact does not appear upon the public records.

Other Hopes than Ours at Stake.

The people of the other States of the Union are watching the campaign in Pennsylvania and Ohio with the most intense interest. The mighty issue of NEGRO SUFFRAGE excites the greatest attention, and all good men everywhere are sending their prayers to Heaven for the overthrow of Radicalism and the supremacy of the white man. On the result in these two great States depends the fate of the Fifteenth Amendment—that measure concerted by the Radical party to keep themselves in power by relegating the white race to the degraded level of the negro. Should the Democracy succeed, the day of niggerism will have passed—should it fail, God alone knows what other humiliations may be in store for us. Work then, Democrats, and justify the hopes that are now centered in you, and show to the world that free white government is not yet dead in America. A Lively Corpses. Says the Lancaster Intelligencer:—What a terrible misadventure that this Democratic party is, to be sure, it has been dead, how many times? Let us see! It was dead in 1861—the Charleston Convention broke its back entirely; it was dead in 1862, dead in 1863, dead in 1864; in 1865 it was too dead to talk about, in 1866 the cunningly contrived bloodshed of Memphis and New Orleans had it again; throughout 1867 it slept, so did the bill, in the silent tomb; but somehow in 1868 it came to life again, and pushed Grant so hard that he only escaped defeat by the skin of his teeth, slipping in by a vote of 35,000 majority in a vote of 3,600,000, that majority made up by negro votes.—And now, here in 1869, this seemingly dead party is so unconquered that ASA PACKER is sure to be the next Governor of Pennsylvania, and Feltton's chance of election in Ohio is almost as good. Verily that sagacious Radical, Don Pratt, understood the Democratic party when he avowed his belief that "at the sounding of Gabriel's horn on the last day, Democrats would come up from the sleep of ages, huzzing for some favorite candidate, and bowing they would vote the ticket, the whole ticket, and nothing but the ticket." Its vitality is truly wonderful, and with its army of voters marshaled and fully equipped, it only waits for the dawning of the second Tuesday of October to overwhelm the cohorts of Radicalism in irretrievable defeat. While we fight the battle here in the Keystone State, let us pray for our gallant brethren in Ohio. Geary as a Peacock! He spreads His Tail! A correspondent of the Luzerne Union, tells the following story about Geary after his first election: A short time previous to Geary's inauguration, he, the Governor elect, paid a visit to the executive mansion avowedly to pay his respects to the incumbent, Mr. Curtin. While sitting in the parlor in conversation upon general topics, Geary suddenly asked if Mr. Curtin could not have the paintings with which its walls were decorated, removed—a few days would make no difference—so that he could unbox his oil paintings, which he found were spoiling, and hang them up. At first Curtin demurred, but finally consented to do so, and the next day gave the requisite instructions, and the pictures were taken down. In a few days an enormous box arrived at the mansion, and with it the new Governor, and the paintings were unpacked in fine condition, evidently to the great joy and satisfaction of their owner. The inventory of the contents of the box is as follows: No. 1—General Geary on horseback. No. 2—General Geary on foot. No. 3—Gen. Geary leading a charge. No. 4—Gen. Geary on a camp stool in front of his tent. No. 5—General Geary sitting at a table signing a bill. There is no doubt of the truth of the above story, because those very pictures adorn the executive mansion to-day, and are the pride and glory of its occupant.
