In ans-wer to a question propounded to the last November, I said that it was the duty of the return judges to take the returns presented to them as contain ing prima facie the truth, but that were I a return judge, and such a pa-per were presented, containing upon its face evidence of fraud, I would never count it until compelled by the er count it until competier by the courts to do so, and especially where such a return as this, so evidently a fraid, was presented, they ought to go as far as possible to avoid it and give prace and make a popular count. There are cases in which the letter of the law should not be strictly enforced, the law should not be strictly entorced, where its non observance would prevent a great wrong, and serve the public good, the truth should be sought and given effect as far as possible.
