PROPOSED

AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION OF

PENNSYLVANIA.

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of

Pennsylvania.

As it Resolved by the Senate and House of Repre-

sentatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in

General Assembly met, That the following

amendment of the Constitution of the Com-

monwealth be proposed to the people for their

adoption or rejection, pursuant to the provi-

sions of the tenth article thereof, to wit,

AMENDMENT.

Strike out the Sixth Section of the Sixth

Article of the Constitution, and in its lieu

thereof the following:

"A State Treasurer shall be chosen by the

qualified electors of the State, at such times

and for such term of service as shall be pre-

scribed by law."

Speaker of the House of Representatives,

WILLIAM A. WALLACE,

Speaker of the Senate.

Approved the fifteenth day of June, Anno

Domini one thousand eight hundred and

seventy-one.
