Three years ago the Campbell's Creek Coal Company, in the Kanawha Valley, commenced the sharing of profits with its men, and on the first occasion divided something over \$6,000. Last year the amount was much less, because the profits were smaller. The result this year is shown in the announcement that on September 20 the company divided \$4,500 among the men. The money is given out in proportion to the amount of wages the men earn, and the last distribution gave each man an average of about \$60. Besides sharing the profits the company does a sort of insurance business among the miners in a novel and commendable manner. In that district the miner is "docked" or forfeits a certain amount of the wages when the coal he turns out has over a fixed per centage of slate. The company mentioned takes the dockage according to the general custom, but that amount, instead of going to the company, is put into a fund for the benefit of the men.
