Let the Good Work Go On.

Every Citizen Is Willing to Pay a Good Price for Coal, But He Kicks on a Royalty—The Coal Baron Need Not Expect to Get the Increase of the Earth and the Earth as Well Simply Because of a Combine—Individual Operators Objeet.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 17.—The action of the general managers of the individual Anthracite Coal Operators' association in New York yesterday, in adopting a resolution requesting the Lehigh Valley coal company to meet the market and sell their coal at the price obtainable at any and all points, in order that line and tidewater prices may be more in harmony is considered here to be in the nature of a protest against the inequality existing between line and tidewater prices. The individual operators represented in the association sell their coal to the lines over which they ship for sixty per cent, of the selling price at tidewater. This tidewater price is invariably lower than the price charged at other points, so that the individual operators receive considerably less for coal at the mines than do the larger producing and carrying interests. At present the individual operators are getting about \$2.40 for stove coal at the mines, this being 60 per cent of the tide price, while owing to the higher prices prevailing at interior points the big companies secure about \$2.40 per ton. At \$2 there is very little profit in mining for the operators, and then contend that either tide prices are too low or line prices too high.

The individual operators mine about 12,000,000 tons of coal annually, and are important factors in the trade, and if their demands are granted the coal trade will be revolutionized by causing a reduction in the price of coal at non-competitive points and by permanently establishing an equality between the line and tidewater prices, the latter being their ultimate aim. Not all of the individual producers of anthracite coal are members of the association, their membership being confined to the shippers over the Lehigh Valley line, but no other company handles as much coal from individual operators as does the Lehigh Valley.

The demand upon the Lehigh Valley is looked upon as the precursor of similar demands to be made on the other companies in an attempt to force the coal combination to equalize line and tidewater prices. What action the Lehigh Valley company will take in the matter could not be learned to-day, but it is probable that a course will be outlined next week and communicated to the Operators' association. The immediate cause of the operators' action is the present demoralized state of the coal trade. Prices are being freely cut by a number of the larger companies with a view to increasing tonnage, and the operators hope to bring the big producers together by means of forcing them to meet competition at a still lower level. For many years there have been protests from coal consumers who were nearer the mines than tidewater consumers over the higher prices which they were compelled to pay for coal. It was brought before the interstate commission and agitated in various ways without the result. The companies maintained prices to their line trade, but cut at New York. Cox & Bro. & Co. said to-day in regard to the action of yesterday by the independent operators: "We have determined to sell coal at all points at proportionate tidewater prices. The various coal companies are charging two prices to the trade, interior points being forced to pay a much higher rate than tidewater consumers. Our plan is to force the leading coal companies to make one price, with a view of making it higher than that which has been prevailing. We are fixing a price at line points equal to tide water price and this will force them either to advance the tidewater price or reduce the line trade price."

The Wave of Commercial Depression Receding and Business Reviving.

Now that the clamor and din of the great political battle which has raged for so many months are dying out it is gratifying to note multiplying and unmistakable signs of a revival of business. The extended wave of commercial depression which started in 1891 to make its sluggish but disastrous circuit of the globe traveled in the same direction as the vast tide-wave of the ocean—from the East to the West. After first traversing the Old World it reached this country early last year. It has moved with tardy step, but there is now every reason to hope that it has broken to pieces and is fast disappearing.

One of the causes, perhaps the chief cause, of the world-wide depression of 1891-1894 was an extensive failure of the crops, first recorded in 1891 in Asia and Russia and in 1892 in large portions of Europe. In 1893 American crops suffered heavily from drought, and the apprehension of short crops in a nation whose living and prosperity are mainly dependent upon the returns of its farms and plantations doubtless greatly intensified the panic of 1893 in the United States. Nor was this depressing apprehension relieved as late as August of the present year. The last summer month closed with gravest anxiety for the corn crop, by far the most important and valuable of our cereals. Our wheat harvest last summer was also deficient and the price of American wheat fell to a phenomenally low figure—touching 55 cents a bushel at New York about the middle of the month—owing exclusively to the fact that the world's wheat supply is now in excess of the demand. Added to these tremendous natural causes of financial panic and commercial depression were the political agitations growing out of repeal of the Sherman silver purchasing law and the McKinley tariff, the overproduction of manufactures and many numerous restrictions of trade which the latter gave rise, and the long tariff debate which kept business in disastrous uncertainty and suspense till August.

The causes, both natural and political, which we have enumerated are the principal causes which have been influential since 1892 in depressing business and retarding commercial enterprise. But these depressing agencies have now spent their force and are practically eliminated from the situation. Since the close of summer it has been ascertained that our year's cereal harvest will suffice for our own needs and will leave quite a large surplus for sale in foreign markets. Our cotton planters, though unable to command a good price for their product, will be consoling themselves by the fact that their cotton crop is exceptionally large. It is too early to predict the wheat outlook for 1895 but late reports of winter wheat are more favorable. The Michigan State crop report just published makes the average condition of winter wheat 94 per cent, which is higher than last year. Since the adjournment of Congress mills and sawmills in many States have been awaking to new life, and indications have not been wanting to show that under the new tariff which went into effect August 28 a new era of commercial and industrial prosperity has begun to dawn on the country.

The well-known trade journal, the Iron Age, notes that the capacity of furnaces in the pig iron industry in blast on November 1, was 158,866 tons, while the capacity of those in blast on August 1, was only 115,356. Our manufacturers and merchants are beginning to discover that the Wilson tariff is already opening up foreign markets for a splendid trade of untold value in the fabrics of American looms and mills.

It remains now for our people to take advantage of the improved conditions for trade which exist both abroad and at home. While there is no artificial boom of business or trade in any quarter of the globe, the restrictions and impediments of domestic business and international commerce have been largely removed. The bug bears which have been so long flourishing for political effect by calumny howlers have done all the mischief they can do. They can no longer unsettle and paralyze business, and the popular reaction from them will be sure and permanent. For several years, at least, we shall be freed from the necessity of making any wholesale tariff revision and there is every reason to believe that the wave of depression which has recently swept over the entire earth will not recur within this century.
