Revealed By Rays.

Fifteen days ago the name of Doctor Roentgen was unknown outside a small circle of purely scientific men. To-day the whole world rings with his name.

That science has no country is once more proved conclusively by the unanimous applause given to this German professor, Roentgen, born in 1842, received his education and had the degree of doctor conferred upon him at the University of Zurich.

It may be interesting at the present moment to give a brief description of the difference between Roentgen rays and Lenard rays. Roentgen rays are not deflected by a magnet; Lenard rays are. Roentgen rays absorb and diffuse less than Lenard rays.

Lenard claims that his rays emanate from the cathode itself; Roentgen that his are born on the luminous spot on the glass walls of the discharge tube, at which the cathode rays terminate.

The most striking feature of this phenomenon is the fact that an agent capable of developing visibility is able to pass through the black cardboard cover, which transmits none of the ultra-violet rays of the sun, and we immediately ask ourselves whether other bodies possess this power.

From the fact that one thin layer of tin foil is hardly noticeable, and that several layers are necessary for casting a shadow on the screen, it can be seen that density is a necessary condition.

It is well known that Lenard's rays passing through thin aluminum foil gave the impression that these rays were actions of the ether, and that they passed diffusely through all bodies.
