Mr. Nye was born in Shirley, Me., in 1850 and grew up on a farm. He studied law later, and in 1876 went to Wyoming territory, where he was admitted to the bar. He afterwards declared that his clients could be hanged effectually without the expense of a lawyer, so he took to writing for newspapers.

His first letters were written for the Cheyenne Sun at \$1 a column. He was afterwards on the staff of the Denver Tribune and subsequently became editor of the Laramie Boomerang. His humorous writings in that paper attracted widespread attention, and he became famous. During recent years his income from his writings and lectures had been \$30,000 a year.
