Left \$60,000 to Her Faithful Maid.

By the will of Miss Caroline L. Smith, of New Haven, Conn., who died last Tuesday, aged fifty-eight years, her maid, Wilhelmina Pfeister, will come into possession of property valued conservatively at \$60,000. Miss Pfeister is of middle age. Miss Smith was a belle thirty or thirty-five years ago, when she was much admired in the best society and in the Yale college set. She was the daughter of Sherman Smith, head of the firm of Smith & Graves, dry goods merchants. Upon the death of her father, about thirty-five years ago, she inherited the estate. For some reason she retired into seclusion in the family residence, in Chapel street, near York street, and of late years has been seen but seldom. It was hinted that an unhappy love affair was the cause. With her was always the faithful maid. The companionship ripened into affection. Miss Smith lived so much in retirement that it is said she had not been out of the city for thirty years, and that she feared sudden death would overtake her if she ventured to ride on an electric car. Another unusual feature of the will is that Miss Smith remembers each of the four surviving children of her father's partner, John S. Graves, with legacies of several thousand dollars. They have late been in somewhat reduced circumstances. John S. Graves in the day of his prosperity was a president of the local gas company. After business reverses he became collector for the same company. Several collateral relatives are also remembered with small bequests. Miss Smith had neither brother or sister.

Case of Burial Alive.

Suspicious of Mrs. Needham's Horrible Fate Verified After Twenty-One Years. The discovery that Mrs. Needham, wife of a farmer, near Roan, Ind., was buried alive twenty years ago has caused a sensation of horror in that neighborhood. The young woman died supposedly when her first child was born in 1880. When the body was straightened for the grave, it is now recalled by some of the women who aided in that duty, doubt was expressed as to whether life was extinct. At their suggestions Mrs. Needham sent for a physician, who, after several tests, declared that there were no signs of life and recommended that the funeral be proceeded with. For several years after the body was buried in Soap Hill cemetery the neighbors discussed the mooted question. It was last week it was decided by Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Bryan, parents of Mrs. Needham to remove the body to Odd Fellows' cemetery. When the casket was exhumed the persons present at the opening of the coffin were astonished to find the glass top broken, the left arm, which the right had been laid upon the breast at the time of the burial, lying beside the trunk, while the right was uplifted, with the hands clenched beneath the head, the hair evidently having been clutched violently in the agony of the moment. The body itself, which had been laid upon the back, was partially turned over, and the surroundings were indicative of a terrible struggle.

Big Engine in Speedy.

Special Train of Colorado Excursionists Tests New Locomotive. Railway men of all classes are watching with much interest the tests of the "1200 series" of engines of the Rock Island road, the largest running out of Chicago in passenger service. Engine No. 1201 was given its first severe test for power and speed last week. The patrons of the Rock Island's first excursion of Colorado occupied fourteen of the largest and heaviest coaches. This was enough for two trains to be pulled by ordinary passenger engines of the day, considering the speed required. The big engine did all that was expected of it and more. Between Chicago and Rock Island it pulled that train of fourteen coaches with ease on schedule time, and when called on for a little extra effort developed a speed of over 72 miles an hour. Engines of that class will haul all the special trains which will be used by the Rock Island in its series of Colorado excursions, at the rate of one fare plus \$2.00 for the round trip. Three more excursions will be given, leaving here July 9th, July 17th and August 1st. The departing time of the special trains will be 4:45 p. m., but on the dates named excursion tickets will also be honored on all regular trains. The special trains to be used are high class throughout. Through dining car service is provided and the run from Chicago to Colorado is made with only one night on the road. Excursion rates will be made to Colorado and Utah from all points on the line of the Rock Island between the Missouri river and Chicago.—Chicago Inter-Ocean.
