LONDON, September 3.—Dr. Krause, former Governor of Johannesburg, and a prominent official of the late Transvaal government, was arrested in London last night on a charge of high treason. He will be arraigned to-day, at the Bow street police court.

For the past four months Dr. Krause has been living in Great Britain. It is alleged that after signifying his allegiance to the British crown he secretly forwarded information to the Boers.
