Opposes Naval Increase. Building Five Battleships a Year Is Too Much, Says Ex-Secretary Long.

John D. Long, former Secretary of the Navy, does not approve the suggestion to build five new battleships every year for the American fighting fleet.

There are many things to be considered before such a wholesale increase in the navy is made. With the present cost of naval construction Congress would hardly be warranted in appropriating for five battleships every year at an aggregate cost of from twenty to twenty-five millions.
