NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, that every person excepting Justice of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the Government of the United States, or of this State, or of this County, or of any city or incorporated district, and also every member of Congress and of the State Legislature and of the select or common Council of any city, or Commissioners of any incorporated district is by law, incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of Judge, Inspector or clerk of any election of the Commonwealth and that no Inspector, Judge or other officer of any such election shall be eligible to any office to be voted for, except that of an election officer.
