Lively Times Now on Yalu River.

Liao Yang Heng the Japanese Forced a Passage on Monday Night.

ST. PETERSBURG, April 30.—(7.25 p.m.)—It is believed in military circles that the Japanese have commenced a movement to cross the Yalu river. It is also reported that the movement has been frustrated.

The Emperor has received a despatch from the commander of the Vladivostok squadron, confirming the reports of the sinking of a Japanese transport of 600 tons, at Wonsan. (Gensan.) The object of the squadron's cruise is to destroy all transports traversing the sea of Japan, show the Russian flag in Corean waters, and impress the population advantageously, also compelling the Japanese to guard all their transport expeditions.

The foreign office denies that Russian troops have been sent to occupy neutral territory, west of the Liao river. The report may have grown out of the stationing of a force on the west bank of the river, opposite New Chawang, to defend the city in that direction, command the river and prevent the Japanese from ascending the stream. No protest has been received from the Chinese government, and it is said that China has no ground to protest.

Sheet Steel Company Shuts Down.

PITTSBURG, April 30.—All but two mills of the American Sheet Steel company's plant at McKeesport closed to-day, throwing out of employment 800 men. Other departments are expected to close later in the week. Employees do not know how long the suspension will last, and the management does not offer any statement.
