King to Give Bible to Virginia Church Richmond, Va., Sept. 19.—Bruton parish, the historical church at Williamsburg, Va., the second oldest church and the church longest in continuous use in the United States, has just received the offer of a Bible to be donated by King Edward VII.

General Meade's Daughter Drops Dead Atlantic City, N. J., Sept. 16.—Miss Margaret B. Meade, daughter of General George Gordon Meade, who commanded the Union forces at Gettysburg, dropped dead in front of the Episcopal church in Chelsea. She was 80 years of age.
