Railroads Hit Back at Ohio. Chicago, Feb. 20.-All forms of transportation except the regular 2cent a mile rate provided by law will be cut off by the railroads in Ohio, according to a decision reached at a conference of passenger representatives of all roads with lines in that state. It was agreed that by eliminating everything except 2-cent fares the railways could in a measure compensate themselves for the loss caused by the new rate law. The action contemplated will deprive Ohioans of all reduced transportation for conventions, of the mileage books, of all charity, business and of all round-trip rates and clergymen's rates.
