# Mr. Roosevelt Declares He Will Not Deviate From It.

## WANTS SQUARE DEAL FOR ALL

Washington, April 2 .- In response to a much-expressed desire that he give definite expression to his views on railroad legislation, President Roosevelt has announced plainly where he stands.

In a letter to C. H. Smith, president of the Illinois Manufacturers' Association, declining an invitation to address that body on the railroad situation the president announced that his attitude today is precisely what it has always been and for that reason there is no need of his making a speech on it.

previous utterances, holding that he has gone over the ground fully. In the passages he quotes he disavows hostility to the roads and proclaims his opposition to government ownership. What he does want is "supervisory and regulatory rights" for the government. He arraigns over-capitalization as a menace to the public, to the stockholder and to the employe of the road. He particularly points out that he is not antagonistic to combination, but wants them to make their agreements public and in the interest of all the people.

He quotes the words in which he demanded a square deal; one that will be just to the corporation and to the shipper; one that will prevent discrimination against any individual and at the same time protect the corporation against "extremists and reactionaries." He also endorses his statement that he wants the roads to be able to get together lawfully for the purpose of settling rates, but adds that the government should have the last say as to the adequacy and justice of the rates.

For several weeks the president has been importuned to declare his attitude toward the railroads. To these requests he gave careful and serious consideration. After fully looking into the subject the president told his advisers that he had come to the conclusion that there was nothing new which he had to say at this time.

To the different men, friendly and unfriendly, who have visited him or written to him, he has answered verbally or in writing that his words and acts spoke for themselves and needed no explanation whatever, and that he should not in his future course, deviate a hair's breadth from the course he has pursued in the past and was now pursuing.

The statement was made from an authoritative source that "even a most cursory examination of what the presi dent has repeatedly said in speech and message will show the utter nonsense of supposing the government has the slightest intention to take any action which would invalidate the safety and stability of the railway securities now issued. The whole legislative program of the president has been proclaimed again and again, as one to insure the future against the mistakes and delinquencies of the past. The president holds that every executive action taken under his administration, whether by the department of justice or by the interstate commerce commission, has furnished its own ample justification. It was pointed out in administration circles that the president has made no reference in his speeches or messages to the question of the physical valuation of railroads. His position on this question, it was said, is that the roads themselves will work out this problem as an item of bookkeeping and reference was made to the fact that two roads-the Northern Pacific and the Great Northern-already have submitted figures as to their physical valuation. It can be announced on authority that the president again will ask congress at its next session, for power to deal with the question of over capitalization of railroads. A similar request was made at the last session, but favorable action was not taken upon it.

### 32 BUILDINGS BURNED

### Widow's Prayer That Home be Spared Was Answered.

Laurens, S. C., March 30 .- Fire at Newberry, S. C., a thriving little city of 8000 population, destroyed 22 residences, 10 stores and two churches, entailing a loss estimated at between \$150,000 to \$200,000, with insurance of about \$85,000. The confiagration started in the rear of the Newberry hotel. A gale was blowing, and the flames spread with great rapidity.

Surrounded on all sides by the flames wa sthe residence of Mrs. J. B. Humbert, a widow of a former Methodist minister, which was never touched, although the heat from the flames scorched the house several times. It is related that Mrs. Humbert during the entire time of the confiagration prayed that her home might be spared, and the way that her prayer was answered is the subject for discussion.

Preached His Own Funeral Sermon. Spartansburg, N. C., March 30. -Thomas Harris, a young white man, formerly a Baptist preacher, was hanged in the jail yard at Gaffney, S. C., for the murder of Mrs. Hortense Morgan, an aged white woman, last November. Before the black cap was adjusted Harris preached his own funeral sermon. He killed Mrs. Morgan by cutting her throat, after which he took \$800 from her clothes.
