

**To Extend Terms of Borough and City Officials.**

Legislature Will Also be Asked to Authorize Opening of New Terms Next December.

HARRISBURG, PA., Dec. 3.—A bill will be prepared for presentation to the Legislature soon after it convenes to carry into effect the constitutional amendment respecting terms of city officials, councilmen, school directors and justices of the peace.

This bill will cover not only the extension of the term of those now in office whose tenure would have expired in April or May next, but also authorize the beginning of terms of their successors on the first Monday of December, as stipulated by the amendments.

It is stated at the capital that this will probably be the only bill needed to enforce amendments, everything else being cared for in the schedule, which was ratified by popular vote.

It is stated at the capitol that the new legislative reference bureau has all of the data necessary to show what laws have been passed relative to counties having more than a million population and will probably be able to assist in the drafting of what measures are needed to meet changed conditions in Philadelphia and Allegheny counties. This will be one of the first tests of the new bureau which was established immediately after the last session.
