Before the opening of the deer hunting season the "Watchman" predicted that the kill this year would be the largest in a long time, and so it has proven. From the most reliable reports we have been able to get there were just 174 deer and 15 bears killed during the season. The best hunting was in the Seven mountains where 106 deer and 7 bears were slaughtered. Some eight or ten does were kill-ed and left lie in the woods, most of them being spoiled when found.
