In the second semester of his Freshman year, Nickle was awarded the president's medal in recognition of the excellence of his classroom work. He again won the medal in his Sophomore year. For three successive years, he has carried off the John W. White scholarship prize, and he has been elected to three honorary fraternities. Nickle is a student in the department of electrical engineering, and is a member of the Penn State unit of the Engineer Reserve corps. Upon completion of his college course next month, Nickle expects to enter the signal corps of the army. Last year he was in charge of the college wireless station.
