Sugar Conservation and How to Keep Flour.

With no material change of permanent character in the sugar situation, it becomes increasingly necessary to continue, and if possible, to increase our restrictions on family consumption of sugar in order that we may thereby build up some reserve stock against the fruit-preserving season which is rapidly approaching.

At the same time, stocks of sugar in the hands of dealers have recently improved somewhat, in many sections of Pennsylvania at least, so that it is now possible to modify in all our counties the restriction on retail sales with less risk of an unequal family distribution and thus avoid some of the inconvenience in buying to which we have recently been subjected.

You may, accordingly, authorize all retailers in your county to sell in quantities as follows:

To consumers residing in towns and

cities 2 to 5 pounds, depending on the size of families. To consumers residing in rural com-

munities, 5 to 10 pounds. In putting this order into effect, derstanding by which consumption will increase proportionate to the increased quantity sale. Endeavor to impress upon the public the necessity for continued strict economy in the use of sugar. Eighty per cent, of normal consumption is the maximum that any family should indulge in. It is better to put up with a restriction now than to have a shortage later on during the canning season, and this shortage can only be avoided by practicing the strictest conservation in

every direction today.

It is hoped to send you in the very near future the outlines of a plan by which we expect to provide home canners with adequate supplies for preserving purposes, so there need be no apprehension in the minds of consumers in this particular. We will also send you the details of a system for rationing manufacturers and confec-

tioners using sugar.

In the meantime you should understand that the sugar shortage in America is not due to a lack of sugar itself. There is practically enough sugar in the West Indias and other parts of the world to supply our normal needs. It is simply a question of transporting this sugar to the United States and the transportation difficulties can not be overcome quickly enough to take care of an unrestricted demand now and still meet the peak requirement of the fruit-matur-

ing months. If we have the patriotic co-operation of the public to carry us safely past this crisis, it is hoped and believed that we may be able to return to more normal conditions later in the year when the crisis is past.

INSTRUCTIONS TO HOUSEKEEPERS. Hot weather frequently produces spoilage in certain flours and meals if they are not properly cared for, especially those which contain a high percentage of fats, moisture or the outer coatings of the grain. To prevent such losses, particularly at this time when bread stuffs are so essen-tial to the allies and ourselves, the following instructions for the storing

of these flours and meals are given: Buy in small quantities. See that flours and meals are in good condition when purchased.

Keep in a cool, dry place. (a) Use tins or covered jars for containers, scalded and perfectly

dried. (b) It is well to use two covered containers alternately, always putting fresh purchases in a clean container, and never mixing the residue from the previous purchase with the fresh pur-

Sterilize before putting away by placing in shallow pans (or clean cotton containers) in an oven and heating slowly, being careful not to burn, or even brown. The flour or meal must be in thin layers and stirred frequently so that every part may be equally heated. After cooling, place in clean covered containers.

Justice Mestrezat Dies Sunday Morn.

Philadelphia, April 28.—Associate Justice Stephen Leslie Mestrezat, of the Pennsylvania Supreme court, died at the Aldine hotel here at 5 a. m. today after an illness of several

Justice Mestrezat's death makes the second vacancy on the Supreme court bench, Justice William P. Potter having died two weeks ago to-day. The Governor has the authority to fill the vacancies until the next general election.

Justice Mestrezat was born in Mapleton, Greene county, and was 70 years old on February 19 last. He was descended from a distinguished French family. He was a graduate of Waynesburg college and of the law department of Washington and Lee department of washington and Lee University, Lexington, Va. In 1871, he was admitted to the Greene county bar and moved to Uniontown in 1872. He was elected district attorney of Fayette county in 1887 and in 1893 he was elected judge of the county. Judge Mestrezat remained on the Fayette bench until he was elected to the Supreme court on the Democratic ticket in 1899. His term began in January, 1900, and would have expired in 1921. He was buried on Tuesday at Uniontown.
