

**WIT FROM CHINA.**

**Samples Show There Has Been Little Change in Human Nature Through the Centuries.**

Although the Chinese may seem serious, he is not without a genuine sense of humor. His literature is highly seasoned with witticisms and humorous situations. Unfortunately, brevity, which is essentially the soul of wit of his proverbs, is impaired in the translation into English. Also there is much of Chinese humor, even that found in the books of the most famous writers, that is too broad for a literal translation.

Nevertheless, human nature is, and has for a thousand years, been fundamentally the same. This is shown by the following epigrams, taken from the work of a writer, Li Shang Yin, who lived twelve hundred years ago in the Flowery Kingdom. The translation from the Chinese was made by Mr. W. F. Mayers.

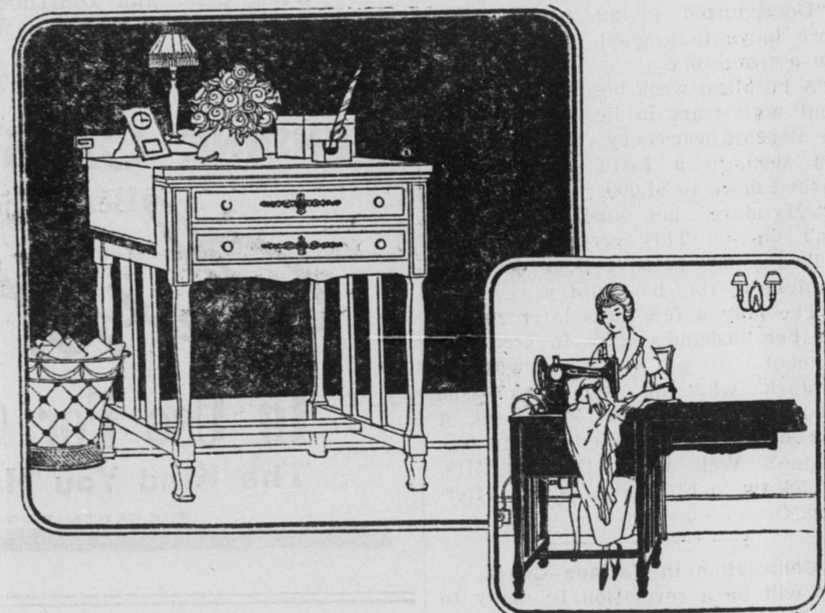
