

# Election Proclamation

God save the Commonwealth, I, E. R. Taylor, High Sheriff of the county of Centre, Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, do hereby make known and give notice to the electors of the County aforesaid that an election will be held in the said County of Centre on the

FIRST TUESDAY IN NOVEMBER, 1924, being the 4th day of November, 1924, for the purpose of electing the several persons hereinafter named, to wit:

Thirty-eight persons for Presidential Electors.

One person for Judge of the Superior Court.

One person for State Treasurer.

One person for Auditor General.

One person for Representative in Congress.

One person for Representative in the General Assembly.

Also to vote for or against a "Proposal to Hold a Constitutional Convention in 1926."

LIST OF NOMINATIONS. The official list of nominations made by the several parties, and as their names will

appear upon the ticket to be voted for on the Fourth day of November, 1924, at the different voting places in Centre County as certified to respectively by the Secretary of the Commonwealth are given in the accompanying form of ballot.

Notice is hereby given that every person, excepting Justice of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment of profit or trust under the Government of the United States or this State, or of any City or Incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or otherwise a subordinate officer or agent who is or shall be employed under the Legislative, Executive or Judiciary department of the State or the United States or of any city or incorporated district, and also that every member of Congress and of the State Legislature, and of the Select or Common Council of any city, or Commissioners of any incorporated district is, by law, incapable of holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of Judge, Inspector or clerk of any district of this Commonwealth and that no inspector, judge or other officer of any such elections, shall be eligible to any office to be then voted for, except that of an election officer.

## SPECIMEN BALLOT

To vote a straight party ticket, mark a cross (X) in the square in the first column, opposite the name of the party of your choice.

A Cross Mark in the square at the head of a group of Presidential Electors, opposite the name of a Party and its Presidential candidates, is a vote for all the Electors of that Party, BUT FOR NO OTHER CANDIDATES.

A Cross Mark in the square opposite the name of any candidate indicates a vote for that candidate.

To vote for a person whose name is not on the ballot, write or paste his or her name in the blank space provided for that purpose. This shall count as a vote either with or without the Cross Mark.

To vote for an individual candidate of another party after making a Mark in the party square, mark a Cross (X) opposite his or her name.

For an office where more than one candidate is to be elected, the voter, after marking in the party square, may divide his or her vote by marking a Cross (X) to the right of each candidate for whom he or she desires to vote. For such office votes shall not be counted for candidates not individually marked.
