

PENNSYLVANIA WARNS MOTOR TRUCK OWNERS

The Pennsylvania Bureau of Motor Vehicles has issued a nationwide warning that the State is strictly enforcing the law concerning the maximum length, weight and height of motor vehicles and combinations of vehicles operating on Pennsylvania highways.

The State law sets maximum length of single motor vehicles at 33 feet and of combinations coupled together at 70 feet.

Particular attention will be paid, the bureau said, to long-swaying motor trucks used to transport automobiles from manufacturers to dealers.

State highway patrolmen will be stationed at all important bridges and highways leading into the State and suspected motor vehicles will be halted and measured.
