

BEST DOGS FOR CHILDREN TO PLAY WITH.

What is the safest dog to buy as playmate and companion for a child? Dog experts and child specialists have just completed a study of 80 distinct breeds of dogs in the official register of the American Kennel Club, and have elected ten of them which they commend as desirable pets for children.

Here is the list, prepared by them in the suggestion of the Woman's Home Companion, with a few words of comment on each breed:

The Newfoundland is a gentle giant, who makes a patient competitor for any child, but must not be kept in the city or in limited quarters.

The English setter and the Irish terrier are "gentlemen" of the dog world, patient and faithful with children.

The Samoyede, snowy white, is sardoniously called "the biteless dog of the human brain."

Among the terriers, particular tability is conceded to the Irish, shaired, fox, Scillyham, Scottish and Cairn. All of these, and especially the first two, are keenly-kept up-and-coming aristocrats, splendid playmates for children.

But perhaps best where merrier rather gentle and affectionate playmate is desired, comes the border terrier. He is an outstanding choice for a small child inclined to timidity where animals are concerned.

Choice among these breeds de-

pends very largely upon two factors: where you live and what the child is like. The larger dogs need plenty of space in order to keep happy and in good condition, and consequently should not be tried in the city. The others are all right for town, suburban or country life.

The closer the similarity of disposition in child and dog, the better the chances of their appealing to each other. Energetic active children of quieter type, the Newfoundland, setter and cocker spaniel are suitable. The Scottish and Cairn terriers are so adaptable that they get along splendidly with children of all temperaments.

NEARLY 10,000 STUDENTS TRAINING FOR TEACHERS.

Approximately 10,000 students are enrolled at present in the thirteen state teachers colleges and the Cheyney Training School for teachers, according to a recent statement by Dr. James N. Rule, Superintendent of Public Instruction. The exact figures are 9849 as of October 15. These students are distributed in the following institutions:

Mansfield has an enrollment of 728, according to Rule's statement. Indiana leads with 1427 students while Cheyney Training School has 166, the smallest group.

All counties in Pennsylvania are represented in the enrollments, ranging from a total of six each from Cameron and Forest counties to 663 from Allegheny county. One hundred sixty-three students are from other States.

REAL TEST TO COME IN STRUGGLE FOR PEACE.

Weighed down as we are with our domestic worries it is a struggle to turn our eyes abroad. Geneva and Japan seem far, far away from the United States.

Yet what is happening over there is, in the long view, even more important to us than what is happening in our present benighted economic state. A great crisis in mankind's long struggle for permanent peace is now impending.

Since 1918 the hope of the world has been to find a method by which another great war can be prevented. That the horrors of the Western front would be nothing as compared with those of the next war is sensed by all who live today. That virtual suicide of civilization would be the result, and dark ages be the lot of humanity, is the settled conviction in every war college of the world.

Stripped of its technicalities, the League-Manchurian crisis means this:

Either peace will be restored through the agency of other nations or the world's only machinery for peace will be shown up as futile. And that futility, once revealed, would mean an armament race such as the world has never seen. That in turn would bring the great nations back to where they were before Sarajevo. And when war came, as it would, there would come chaos and the downfall of civilization.

What is happening in Geneva and Japan today, therefore, is bigger than Manchuria. It is the test of the world's one and only agency for peace. The entire effort against war, accumulated over the centuries, is at stake.

Let the negotiations win, let the world be convinced that the League

of Nations, or the Briand-Kellogg peace machinery, will work, and the greatest forward step of all time will have been taken.

Let them fail—but they must not! Geneva and Japan are not remote points. They are local stories today, with a very real interest to every man capable of bearing arms, and of very real interest to every mother, wife or sweetheart of such a man, in the whole United States. —Pittsburgh Press.

GETTING TAGS NOW AVOIDS X-MAS RUSH

Pennsylvania vehicle owners can aid the Christmas, "early mailing" campaign of the post office department by posting their applications for 1932 registration now, the bureau of motor vehicles of the State Department of Revenue announces.

"Mail your 1932 applications for motor registration now," said a bureau statement. "By doing so you will clear the way for the heavy pre-Christmas mail. Not only will motor vehicle owners help relieve Pennsylvania post office employees of the additional burden of handling applications and tags along with Christmas mail but they also will be aiding the bureau of motor vehicles in the prompt and efficient performance of its duty."

"Send in your application now and get your tags before the Christmas mail rush is on. Your 1932 tags can be used on and after December 15."

The post office department is co-operating with the State Department of Revenue in facilitating prompt delivery of license plates. Let automobile owners co-operate with both by mailing applications now.
