GENERAL ELECTION PROCLAMATION. WHEREAS, in and by an act of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, entitled 'An Act to regulate the General Elections within the Commonwealth,' it is enjoined upon me to give notice of such elections and to summarize said notice what officers are to be elected: I, JOHN ROBERTS, Sheriff of the County of Beaver, do hereby make known and give this public notice to the electors of the county of Beaver, that a General Election will be held in said county on the Second Tuesday in October Next, at the several Election Districts, as follows: The electors of Borough township will meet at the Court House in the borough of Beaver. The electors of Bridgewater township will meet at the public brick school house in said borough. The electors of Moon township will meet at the house now occupied by Amariah Hendrickson in said township. The electors of Hopewell township will meet at the school house in the village of Scottsville, in said township. The electors of Alexander township will meet at the house of Alexander Thompson, dec'd, in said township. The electors of Racoon township will meet at the house of David Ewing, in said township. The electors of Frankfort district will meet at the house of George Dungan, in Frankfort. The electors of McGuire's district will meet at the house of John Porter in the village of Hanover. The electors of Greene township will meet at the house of Elijah Niswanger, in Hookstown. The electors of Ohio township will meet at the house now occupied by Jamison Elliott, in said township. The electors of righton township (not embraced in Industry district) will meet at the house near Ripley Eakin's, in said township. The electors of the borough of Fallston will meet at the Academy in Fallston. The electors of Patterson township will meet at the school house in the village of Brighton. The electors of Chippewa township will meet at the house of Asarian Inman, in said township. The electors of South Beaver township will meet at the house of John Rowe, in said township. The electors of Darlington township will meet at the Academy in Darlington. The electors of Big Beaver township will meet at the house of widow Miller, in said township. The electors of Franklin township will meet at the house of Mark R. Clark, in said township. The electors of North Sewickley township will meet at the house occupied by John Miller, on land of 86th, Chew. The electors of Pulaski township will meet at Dougherty's school house, No. 4, in said township. The electors of Marion township will meet at the house of George Hartzell, jr., in said township. The electors of New Brighton borough and district will meet at the school house in said borough. The electors of Rochester township will meet at the Boleville School House, in said township. The electors of the borough of Rochester will meet at the school house in Rochester. The electors of Freedom borough and district will meet at the school house in Freedom. The electors of New Sewickley township will meet at the house of John Fazel, in said township. The electors of Industry district will meet at the school house in Industry. The electors of Harmony township will meet at the Hotel in the Economy. The electors of the borough of Westmoreland will meet at the house of George C. Minis, in said township. At which time and places the qualified electors as aforesaid will elect by ballot: One person for Governor of Pennsylvania. One person for Judge of Supreme Court of Pennsylvania. Two persons as members of the House of Representatives of Pennsylvania, in conjunction with Lawrence county. One person for Sheriff of Beaver county. One person for Register & Recorder of Beaver county. One person for Treasurer of Beaver county. One person for Clerk of Court of Beaver county. One person for Commissioner of Beaver county. One person for Poor House Director of Beaver county. One person for Auditor of Beaver county. Two persons for Trustees of Beaver Academy. Notice is hereby given, That every person except Justices of the Peace, who shall hold any office or appointment as aforesaid, shall be sworn in and take the oath of office and qualification before the Governor or the United States or of any city or incorporated district, whether a commissioned officer or agent, who is or shall have been employed under the Legislative, Executive or Judiciary department of this State or of the United States or of any city or incorporated district; and also that every member of Congress, and of the State Legislature, and of the Select or Common Council of any city, commissioner of any incorporated district, or any person holding or exercising at the same time the office or appointment of Inspector, Judge, or Clerk of any election of the Commonwealth, and that no Judge, Inspector or any other officer or agent, shall be eligible to any of the offices aforesaid. Also, in and by the fourth section of an Act approved the 19th of April, 1840, it is enacted that the 13th section of the act passed July 24, 1839, entitled 'An Act relating to the election of the Commonwealth, shall not be construed so as to prevent any military officer or borough officer from service as Judge, Inspector or Clerk at any general or special election in this Commonwealth, or as to prevent any person from being elected to any of the offices aforesaid. And the act of Assembly, entitled 'An Act relating to the elections of this Commonwealth,' passed July 24, 1839, provides as follows: That the Judge and Inspectors chosen as aforesaid, shall meet at the respective places appointed for holding the election in the districts to which they respectively belong, before 9 o'clock on the morning of the Second Tuesday in October in each and every year, and each said Judge and Inspector shall appoint a clerk, who shall be a qualified voter of said district. In case the persons who shall have received the second highest number of votes for Inspector shall not attend on the day of an election, then the persons receiving the second highest number of votes for Judge at the next preceding election shall act as Inspectors in his place; and in case the person who shall have received the highest number of votes for Inspector shall not attend on the day of an election, then the person receiving the second highest number of votes for Judge at the next preceding election shall act as Inspector in his place; and in case the person elected Judge shall not attend, then the Inspector who shall have received the highest number of votes for Inspector shall act as Judge in his place; and if a vacancy shall continue in the Board for the space of one hour after the time fixed by law for the opening of the election, the qualified voters of the township ward or district, in which such officers shall have been elected, shall be present at the place of election, shall elect one of their number to fill such vacancy. It shall be the duty of Assessors respectively to attend at the place of holding every general, special or township election, during the time such election is kept open, for the purpose of giving information to the Inspectors and Judges when called on, in regard to the rights of any persons assembled there, and to such elections, or such matters in relation to the same as may be required.
