APPOINTMENT.—Governor Curtin has appointed John Kennedy Ewing, son of ex-Judge National Ewing, to fill the vacancy caused by the decease of Judge Ewing, in the Fourteenth District, composed of the counties of Washington, Fayette and Greene.

HONORABLE STEAMING.—It appears that the Erie and Pennsylvania Railroad are pursuing their project in the southern part of the county. Mr. Cotter and Mr. Torrence, of Deacon, and Mr. Berry of Moon Township, have each had a horse stolen lately.

MILITARY CHANGES.—An order has been issued by the War Department changing the name of the Department of the Susquehanna to the Department of Pennsylvania, and Major General Cadwalader is assigned as commander, with headquarters in Philadelphia. The Juniata District has been enlarged to embrace all the border counties, and Brig. General Ferry retained as commander, with headquarters changed from Bedford to Chambersburg.

NEW BRIDGE AT PITTSBURG.—The Government of building a new bridge across the Monongahela, at the confluence of the two rivers, is now being pushed forward in a manner that indicates that the work will soon be commenced. The Pittsburg Bridge Company are making all the necessary preparations for that purpose. It is proposed to make the bridge consist of eight spans 210 feet from center to center of piers, or 201 feet clear of piers, and one span 317 feet between center of piers. The clear width of the roadway must be 19 feet, with sidewalks at each side eight feet in width.

REVISING THE ENROLLMENT LISTS.—New orders have just been issued from the Provost Marshal General's office relating to the revision and correction of the enrollment lists, with a view to having them ready for future emergencies. General Fry says the names of all persons who are liable to military duty, taking up their residence in sub-districts, as well as those who from time to time become liable, shall be added to the enrollment lists, and all persons who enlist or remove permanently from any district, or whose liability terminates while in Federal service, shall be struck off, and in case of removal, whenever practicable, the name of the person removed will be struck off, and he will be enrolled by that name.

School for Soldiers Orphans.

Hon. Thos. H. Burrows, State Superintendent of Soldiers' Orphans, is ready to receive applications for the education and maintenance of orphans entitled to the benefit of the act passed by the last Legislature. The following are the names of the Committee for Beaver county: M. W. J. J. C. Wilson, Mrs. Ella Orr, Miss M. J. Anderson, and Mrs. Sarah L. Minis. The friends of orphans will apply to any of the above, who will furnish with proper blanks, and instructions for filling them.

The proper subjects for the benefit of the schools are, the children of soldiers who have been killed in battle or died of wounds, or of disease contracted in the service of the United States, either in the army or navy, and who were actually residents of Pennsylvania at the time of entering the service. The children must be under fifteen years of age, and at the time of application residents of Pennsylvania, and dependent upon charity for support, or on the exertions of a mother, or other person destitute of the means to afford proper education and maintenance.

The Superintendent has already selected some of the schools to which those orphans are to be sent, and no time should be lost by those who desire their benefits. When the application is made and accepted, an order for admission to the proper school will be sent to the mother, or other person applying, together with necessary instructions.

The State will provide education, clothing, boarding, washing, books, etc., in the schools, but the children are expected to be sent to the schools by their relations or friends, together with such articles of clothing as they may have on hand to be used; until others are procured for them.

There is no restriction as to the number of children who may be admitted from one family. Oil discoveries and surface indications of oil are being made and found in all the surrounding counties—Beaver, Venango, Lawrence, Clarion, Crawford, Armstrong, Indiana, Fayette, and Greene, and even our Butler neighbors are of that opinion that oil will be found in that county. They allege that all that is wanted to discover petroleum under their territory is the proper experiment. A great many wells have been commenced and bored down a few hundred feet and then abandoned by the contractors because they did not understand the business and lack the proper equipment. In this connection, has it occurred to the people of Allegheny county that there may be good oil territory in our midst? In boring for oil in Manchester, a few years ago, Wm. B. Ross, Esq., struck a splendid paying salt well, with which he contented himself without further prosecuting his search. If similar experiments were tried along the flats, creeks and runs of the Allegheny, Monongahela and Ohio valleys, there is no reason why they should not be made similar. At all events, if neither oil nor salt should be discovered, there is no doubt, coal, can be found, and that is bound to be the permanent paying staple of the neighborhood. It will cost much less to try the experiment of boring for oil in our vicinity than it would in any of the adjoining counties, and we should like to see some of our own capital expended in this direction.—Pitts. Com.

The price of coal is somewhat alarming to the citizens of Beaver. It has risen to between 2 and 3 cents per bushel, which is a very high price for the coal of the pit, and there is a gloomy prospect that before mid-winter it will be twenty cents, and even more. Hitherto it was sold by measure, which could be made by the seller to appear sufficiently large, when it might be rather small. We learn that the Town Council have passed an ordinance requiring all coal to be delivered within the Borough to be weighed. We learn also that the coal proprietors, as a body, will deliver their coal at the Beaver R. R. Station, at fourteen cents per bushel, which will cost the citizens one and a-half cents more delivered at their homes.

U. S. GOVERNMENT.

The Secretary of the Treasury has authorized the issue of Treasury Notes, payable three years from August 16th, 1864, with semi-annual interest at the rate of 7 1/2 per cent. per annum.

These notes will be convertible at the option of the holder at maturity, into six per cent gold bearing bonds, payable not less than five nor more than twenty years from their date, as the Government may elect.

The notes will be issued in denominations of \$50, \$100, \$500, \$1,000 and \$5,000, and all subscriptions must be for fifty dollars or some multiple of fifty dollars.

The notes will be transmitted to the owners free of transportation charges as soon after the receipt of the original Certificates of Deposit as they can be prepared.

As the notes draw interest from August 16, persons making deposits subsequent to that date must pay the interest accrued from date of note to date of deposit.
