Important General Laws

The following important laws were enacted at the recent session of our Legislature. We print them from official copies:

An Act relative to the admission of parties to judicial proceedings as witnesses in certain cases:

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that in all trials and judicial proceedings at the bar, administrator, trustees or other person acting in fiduciary or representative character, although a party to the proceeding, not having any interest in the subject matter of controversy, may be examined as a witness, and the right to claim commissions or compensation shall not be deemed or taken to be an interest disqualifying such person from being examined by any other witness. Provided, that this act shall not apply to any case in which a verdict has been rendered, judgment rendered, and a writ of error taken, nor to any case now pending in any court of this Commonwealth.

FEE BILL OF ALDERMEN AND JUSTICES

OF THE PEACE.

An Act increasing the fees of Justices of the Peace and Aldermen and Constables in certain counties in this Commonwealth:

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the fees to be received by Justices of the Peace, Aldermen and Constables as follows:

Information or complaint on behalf of the Commonwealth, for every ten words 2 cents.

Decretal entry on behalf of the Commonwealth, 20 cents.

Warrant or mittimus, on behalf of the Commonwealth, 10 cents.

Writing, examination or complaint of defendant, or a deposition, for every ten words 2 cents.

Administrating an oath or affirmation, 10 cents.

Taking a recognizance in any criminal case and returning the same to court, 50 cents.

Entering judgment or conviction for fine, 20 cents.

Recording conviction or copy thereof, for every ten words 2 cents.

Warrant to levy fine or forfeiture, 40 cents.

Bail piece and return or supersedeas, 25 cents.

Dismissal to jailor, 25 cents.

Entering disownment in case of assault and battery, 40 cents.

Entering complaint of master, mistress or apprentice, 20 cents.

Notice to master, mistress or apprentice, 25 cents.

Hearing parties and discharging complaint, 40 cents.

Holding inquisition under landlord and tenant act, or in case of forcible entry, each day \$2.00.

Prerogative to Sheriff, 50 cents.

Recording proceedings, \$1.00.

Writ of restitution, 50 cents.

Warrant to appraise damages, 40 cents.

Warrant to sell strays, 50 cents.

Warrant to appraise swine, entering return, advertising, etc., \$1.50.

Entering action in civil case, 20 cents.

Summons, cap or sub, each 20 cents.

Every additional name after the first, 5 cents.

Subpoena duces tecum, 25 cents.

Entering return of summons and qualifying constable, 15 cents.

Entering of capias and bail bond, 10 cents.

Every continuance of a suit, 10 cents.

Trial and judgment, 50 cents.

Entering judgment by confession or by default, 25 cents.

Taking special bail, 25 cents.

Entering satisfaction, 10 cents.
