Nover soize them by the wool on when they were fat. The best way is to avoid the wool altogether. Accus tom yourself to catch them by the hind leg, or, what is still better, by the neck, placing one hand under the jaws and the other just back of the cars .out danger to the animal or to himscif.

## Fattening Beef.

A farmer of large experience tells us he fattens his beeves in summer. and only calculates to have them hold their own and be ready for sale when -So great has been the desire of the the market suits him; and he asserts will make fully as much beef as eight quarts of new corn meal, with the best of hay, in cold weather.
