It is under the supervision of a board of Directors and was incorporated in 1864. The Directors are as follows: Gen. W. W. Irwin; Thos. F. Robinson, M. D.; Wm. Kennedy, Esq.; Hon. B. B. Chamberlin; E. Kendrick M. D.; and Benj. Bedison, Eeq. Dr. Kendrick, formerly connected with the asylums of Ohio, is Superintend ent and chief-executive officer in the institution. The purposes of the Retreat will be gathered from the following, which we clip from one of its circulars:

The principal design of the Retreat is to furnish to the independent class of our citizens a comfortable home for chronic insanity, where they may receive that individualized care and treatment so essential to their wellbeing, and which they cannot obtain-except at greatly increased expense -in private families or ordinary public receptacles. Until the institution shall be entire filled with this class, however, stituble recent cases will be admitted to the Retreat. Successful results, in several instances of recent origin aiready received, as well as the bumanity of affording every facility for speedy recovery to such persons, indicate the propriety of extending the benefits of the institution to them also.


