The Secretary of War is in receipt of some recent dispatches from the Plains, which state that the prospects of a summer war are diminishing. The supplies to the army, some of which are to be temporarily loaned to the Indians, are pretty well advanced and every arrangement made to keep the tribes in order.

It is charged by Delano's Washington friends that he has manifested an opposition to the President's policy of securing his election as United States Senator, to succeed Senator Sherman.

The Sheriff and his guard resisted bravely, but the mob being too strong, it was found necessary to call out the military force, which fired upon the rioters, killing four instantly and wounding many more.
