THE VALLEY OF DEATH. From Blackmore's Travels in the Eastern Archipelago, published by the American Geographic Society, is the story of the famous Valley of the Upsas Tree. Indian Affairs - Executive Order. Executive Order, June 30, 1895. A commission of citizens, having been appointed by the President, under authority to inquire into the Indian Affairs, and to report thereon to the President. The commission is composed of the following members: Messrs. W. Walsh, of Philadelphia; J. O. Johnston, of St. Louis; G. M. Stewart, of Philadelphia; H. V. Campbell, of St. Louis; E. S. Dodge, of New York; R. T. Bostwick, of New York; H. W. Johnston, of New York; and H. S. Lane, of Indiana. The following resolutions were adopted by the commission: 1. That the Commission shall be furnished with the full opportunity to inspect the records of the Indian Affairs, and to obtain full information as to the condition of the Indian population in the United States. 2. That the Commission shall have full power to inquire into the management of the Indian Affairs, and to report thereon to the President.
