POST-OFFICE DEPARTMENT. The accompanying report of the

Postmaster General furnishes a full and satisfactory exhibit of the operations of the Postoffice Department during the year. The ordinary revenues of the Department for the ti-cal year ended June 30, 1872, amounted to \$21,915,422.37, and the expenditures to \$26,658,195.31. -Comoured with the previous fiscal year the increase of revenue was \$1,878,-350.95, or 937 per cent, and the increase of each expenditure \$2,203,-188,23, or 829 percent. Adding to the ordinary revenues the annual appropriation of \$700,000 for free matter, and the amounts paid to the sub-sidized mail steamship lines from special appropriations, the deficiency paid out of the general Treasury was \$3,317,765.94, an excess of \$389,707.28 over the deficiency for the year 1871. (wher interesting statistical information relating to our rapidly extending postal service is furnished in this report. The total length of railroad mail routes on the 30th of June, 1872, was 57,911 miles, 8,077 additional miles of such service having been put into operation during






