> COUNTERFEITS .- We are sor notes of the BANK OF GETTYSBURG in circulation. We have seen one, which is payable to J. KERR, dated Nov. 1, 1821, and tolerably well executed. The following are the most obvious particulars in which the gen vine and counterfeit notes differ:

> On the right hand, upper corner of the Note, around the word "Five," there are a number of small rings, which in the spurious notes are single, and in the genuine are double, that is one within the other. In the vignette of the genuine Note, the swingletree touches the tail of the horse, and in the counterfeit, there is a considerable space between them. The work around the figure V. on the left hand upper corner of the spurious note, is much lighter than that of the genuine and the name of the President is spelt M'Conoughy instead of M'Conaughy.
