Forty-five gave their names as having embraced religion, while many more who were converted during the meeting, had left the ground before its close. The order, during the entire meeting, was unexampled. On Sunday it was estimated that over one thousand people were on the ground, and amid this vast multitude, not one instance of drunkenness was seen; not even loud or unnecessary talking, and all agree that better order was never witnessed on any similar occasion.
