Making Fence Posts Durable.

All posts will rot, sooner or later, and no method will put off the period of decay very long. Yet something can be done. Charring the lower end before sitting it, is not labor lost, although it must be remembered that the charring process often cracks the timber, and so allows the moisture to penetrate the post and thus induces decay.

A correspondent suggests soaking the lower ends in a solution of blue vitriol (sulphate of copper)—all that will dissolve in water—and says that this has been used with success on shingles, spouts, bean-poles, and wood in other forms exposed to the weather.
