PROCLAMATION FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION, TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, AUGUST 2, 1864.

IN THE NAME AND BY THE AUTHORITY OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, ANDREW G. CURTIN, Governor of the said Commonwealth.

To JOHN ALDREAD, Esq., Sheriff of the County of Bedford—Sends Greeting.

WHEREAS A joint resolution proposing certain amendments to the Constitution of this Commonwealth, which are as follows, viz: And Whereas, it is provided in the tenth article of said Constitution...

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, for the purpose of deciding upon the approval and ratification, or rejection, of the said amendments...

WHEREAS A joint resolution, proposing certain amendments to the Constitution of this Commonwealth, has been agreed to by a majority of the members elected to each house of the Legislature...

A JOINT RESOLUTION PROPOSING CERTAIN AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION.

Be it resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the following amendments be proposed to the Constitution of the Commonwealth...

SECTION 1. Whenever any of the qualified electors of this Commonwealth shall be in any actual military service, under a requisition from the President of the United States...

SECTION 2. There shall be two additional sections to the eleventh article of the Constitution, to be designated as sections eight and nine, as follows:

SECTION 8. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature, containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills...

SECTION 9. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers or privileges has been conferred upon the Legislature by the courts of this Commonwealth...

SECTION 10. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills...

SECTION 11. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers or privileges has been conferred upon the Legislature by the courts of this Commonwealth...

SECTION 12. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature containing more than one subject, which shall be clearly expressed in the title, except appropriation bills...

SECTION 13. No bill shall be passed by the Legislature granting any powers, or privileges, in any case, where the authority to grant such powers or privileges has been conferred upon the Legislature by the courts of this Commonwealth...
