EARLY DESCRIPTION OF OIL SPRINGS.—The fol-lowing passage, copied from the Massachusetts Mag-azine for July 1702, may interest those who have struck, or are expecting to strike "ile." In the northern parts of Pennsylvania there is a creek called oil creek, which empties itself into the Alleghany river, issuing from a spring, on the top of which floats an oil similar to what is called Bar-badoes tar, and from which may be collected by one man several gallons in a day. The American troops, in marching that way, halted at the spring, collected the oil, and bathed their joints with it. This gave them great relief, and rid them immediately from the rheumatic complaints with which many of them were affected. The troops drank freely of the wa-ters; they operated as a gentle purge.
