AN IMPORTANT PENSION DECISION.—We learn that the Commissioner of Pensions has decided that persons disabled by wounds received in battle while temporarily serving with any regularly organized military or naval force of the United States, since March 1st, 1861, but not regularly enlisted, and the widows dependent mothers, or sisters, or minor children under sixteen years of age, or those who, serving in like manner, have been or may be killed, are entitled, on satisfactory proof, to the benefit of the act of March 3d, 1861, on the conditions therein prescribed.
