<b>PRESENT HINTS.</b> Weeds.—Allow no weeds to mature on your cultivated lands; eradicate all, and de- stroy them thoroughly, for one weed will be sufficient for the perpetuation of its kind, and will foul a greater extent of surface than can be cleansed effectually in a year. Most weeds make good articles in the compost heap, and when used for this purpose may be made to repay the cost of gathering them for manure. All vegetables are more or less valuable for this purpose. <i>Occupy all the Soil.</i> —When lands have been plowed and prepared for the reception of seeds, it should be occupied—no waste hand allowed. Wide margins around com and potato fields, and large bulks may be profitably occupied with a variety of crops.
