U.S. ARMY CLAIM AGENCY BOUNTY, BACK PAY, PENSIONS,

BOUNTY AND BACK PAY. BOUNTY AND BACK PAY.

To enable those who may have claims upon the United States for moneys due deceased officers and soldiers on account of military services rendered, while in the regular or volunteer service, we publish the following order of payment:

First.—If the deceased was Married, payment will be made: 1st, to the widow; 2d, if no widow, to his child or children (if minors, to a guazdian.)

SECOND.—If he died unmarried: 1st, to the father; 2d, if the father is dead, to the mother; 3d, if both parents are dead, to the brothers and sisters, collectively; lastly, to the heirs general (to be distributed in accordance with the laws of the State in which the deceased had his domicile.)

In the number entitled to Bounty may be added the pro rata Bounty due soldiers discharged for wounds received in actual battle.

PENSIONS. PENSIONS.

Under the Act of Congress, approved July 14th, 362, pensions are granted to the following classes persons: 1 st. Invalids disabled since March 4th, 1861, in he military and naval service of the United States in the line of duty.

the military and haval service of the United States in the line of duty.

2d. Widows of officers, soldiers, or seamen, dying of wounds received or of disease contracted in the military or naval service as above.

3d. Children under sixteen years of age, of such deceased persons, if their be no widow surviving, or from the time of the widow's second marriage.

4th. Mothers (who have no husband living) of officers, soldiers, or seamen, deceased as aforesaid, provided the latter have left neither widow nor children under sixteen years of age; and provided also, that the mother was dependent, wholly or in part, upon the deceased for support.

5th. Sisters under sixteen years of age of such deceased persons, dependent on the latter, wholly or in part, for support; provided there are no rightful claimants of either of the last preceding classes.
