THE ORIGIN OF SOAP, The application of soap as a detergent is not of high antiquity. Like other useful things—electric communication, for instance —it seems to have been known as a fact for a considerable time before it was turned to its most serviceable account. Soap at first was Jacob Semier, hauling gans from Schellsconsiderable time before it was turned to its most serviceable account. Soap at first was merely a cosmetic for smoothing the hair and brightening the complexion. When once its valuable detersive powers were discovered-doubtless by accident—its employment spread rapidly. Their trade, and the manner of carrying it on, were regulated by laws such as the *Lex Me-tella de fullonibus*. At one time fuller's earth (found of a very superior capility in tella de fullonatous. At one time fuller's earth (found of a very superior quality in Staffsrdshire, Bedfordshires, and other Eng-lish counties) was considered so indispensa-ble for the dressing of cloth, that, to prevent foreigners from rivaling English fabrics, it was made a contraband commodity, and its eventuation made accounty commodity. was made a contraband commodity, and its exportation made equally criminal with the heinous and wicked export of wool! How completely public opinion has changed. No weathercock could make a more perfect gyra-tion from North to South, from East to West. What is it criminal to import now? Convicts and contraband of war, perhaps, but certainly not harmless earth and wool.—London Gro-cer. cer.
