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THE STATE REGIMENTAL FLAGS. Committee in Charge of their Reception, July 4, 1866. Call for a Meeting of the Committee of Arrangements.

INDIANA, Pa., May 11, 1866. His Excellency, A. G. Curtin, Governor of Pennsylvania. SIR—At the meeting of those members and officers of the legislature, at its late session, and of officers in the Executive Department at Harrisburg, who have lately been in the military service of the United States, held in the Capitol at Harrisburg, on the 19th inst., at the instance of your Excellency to adopt measures in aid of the reception, for preservation among the archives of the State, of the flags that were presented by the State to, and carried by the different regiments Pennsylvania gave to the army that suppressed "the rebellion," it was

Resolved, That the ceremony of the reception, for preservation among the State archives, of the flags that were presented by the State to the Pennsylvania regiments in the late war against the rebellion, be conducted by His Excellency, Governor A. G. Curtin, on the Capitol at Harrisburg, on the Independence Square, Philadelphia, and the Chairman of this meeting shall appoint a committee, representing the different military divisions of the Commonwealth, of persons who have lately been in the military service of the United States, to assist his Excellency in the arrangements for conducting the ceremony of the flag reception.

The President has ordered pardons to be issued to all North Carolinians who had applications or petitions on file and directed to be completed and sent to the petitioners. This included all the petitions from that State on file in the office of the Attorney General several hundred in number.

WASHINGTON, May 4.—The bill for the admission of Colorado, which passed the House yesterday, was sent to the President to-day. There is no doubt of his signing it, as he sent a message to Congress asking for its admission.
