tirinding Corn on the Cob

WE regard the practice with no favor if the corn is good. Analyses of the silver and jewels of gold, and raiment, ob of well natured corn show that it contains scarcely any nutriment. It was obviously not made to be eaten. The cob parts with all it can of nutriment to the kernels, and is no more fit to be fed out than sawdust. When immature corn nubbins, and cars that have not dried well in the field are to he fed, the case is different. The cole of these contain a good deal of valuabla food, and, if the cars be kiln-dried they may probably be ground to very good advantage. Besides kiln drying, if the temperature be increased nearly to scorching, will convert a portion of the tenderest cellulose which would soon harden to woody fiber, into a digestible substance like starch or gum. This can, however, seldom he done, hence it is best to break up unsuand corn with a hatchet into pieces an inch


