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FATAL ACCIDENT - On Thursday morning August 13th, James Brader, young man in the employ of M. H. City of Salem township, was engaged in pulling rails with a two-horse team, and while the team was pulling one of the rails, or from some other use, the horses became unmanageable, and started off at a full run, when Mr. Brader was thrown from his seat, and the wheels of the wagon passing by his shoulder and breast, killing him instantly.
