Dedication at Benton.

To the Editor of the Columbian:
To-day the town of Benton was enlivened by the presence of quite a number of strangers. The occasion was the dedication of the Odd Fellows' Hall in the upper part of S. K. ALBERTSON's new building. The address was delivered by Capt. C. B. BROCKWAY, and it is but simple truth, to say, that the speaker did honor to himself, and justice to the cause for which he was pleading. Indeed, we could scarcely recognize, in the calm, smooth, and beautiful orator of to-day, the sharp, rough, political controversialist of former occasions. Without claiming antiquity for the order, he reviewed the Eternal principles upon which it is founded, and illustrated them by events of the past, recorded in Religious and Profane history, Social, Political and Religious life of the present time.
